

RUBBER WORKERS JOIN SIT-DOWNERS

United Automobile Workers of America thunders its rejection of a plea from the international union to abandon a sit-down strike, which left 1,721 men idle in the plant of the Fisher Body corporation here early today.

In a tumultuous meeting which began last night and continued nearly six hours, the auto workers voted by acclamation to proceed with the strike after Fred Pieper, a member of the international executive board, urged them to return to work.

Both the U. A. W. A. and General Motors professed ignorance of plans to negotiate a settlement. Corporation executives said neither the Fisher plant nor the Pontiac Motor Car factory, dependent upon the body-producing unit, would open before Monday.

Suspensions Blamed The sit-down began a few hours after the management insisted upon suspending four workers it blamed for a 12-hour strike in the Fisher plant earlier in the week. It was the third such suspension of operations in Michigan General Motors plants this week, the other having taken place in the Cadillac motor car division at Detroit Wednesday. That sit-down lasted only a few hours.

south of the Yellow river. Chinese were said to have repulsed three Japanese attempts to cross the stream but fighting was in progress at Lohow, just south of the river and north of Tsinanfu, the provincial capital. Heavy artillery firing was heard north of Tsinanfu, Consul John M. Allison left the city for Nanking, but 20 Americans remained. Chinese officers said they expected Japanese to attempt a landing along Lachow bay for a drive toward Weishien to isolate the Shanghai-Nanking peninsula from the war zone. Japanese have extensive commercial interests in the area. Along the center of the "Hindenburg" line 50 miles west of Shanghai, Japanese advancing along the Shanghai-Nanking railroad reached Nansuiko, the last Chinese defense line before Soochow itself.

having earnings up to \$25,000 would take care of about 88 per cent of the nation's corporations that had not income last year. A \$10,000 limit would help 77.5 per cent of the firms and \$15,000 top would aid 82.96 per cent.

Vinson asserted "we had debts and plant expansion in mind" in making the tentative decision today.

The chairman explained if the committee finally determined all corporations with income up to \$25,000 should be exempt from the undistributed profits levy, these corporations could use any part, or all, of their earnings to pay off debts, or expand their plants, and thus would need no additional relief on that score.

Corporations with deficits and impaired capital would be helped similarly, he said. He added committee men still were studying the question of extending some form of partial exemption to the larger corporations which will not be freed entirely of the undistributed profits tax load.
