F. D. R.'S MOTHER DAMAGE SUIT LOSER

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Dec. 20. (AP)—Frederick Groves, of New Rochelle, was awarded \$21,000 damages by a state supreme court jury today in his suit against Mrs. James Roosevelt, mother of the president, and her chauffeur, Louis E. Delweg.

Groves was injured by the Roosevelt car at Park avenue and 57th street, New York, last April 3. The car was driving. Mrs. Roosevelt was not in the car.

Groves, who is 24, married and the father of a 2-year-old girl is a former glove salesman. He testified at the trial that he was destitute and unable to work because of his injuries.

William D. Reed, of New York, counsel for the defendants, moved to have the verdict set aside as contrary to the weight of evidence. Justice Mortimer H. Patterson granted a stay of execution in the judgment pending appeal.

OREGON EVENTS FLASHED FROM WIRE SERVICE

PORTLAND, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Frank J. Hauner, 59, was instantly killed yesterday when crushed by an elevator he was attempting to fix at the Seiling Hirsch building, of which he was superintendent.

MASHFIELD, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Allocation of \$60,000 for a new bridge over Catching Inlet, near Eastside on the Coos river highway, was announced by the state highway department.

SALEM, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The management of the Salem airport was changed by the city council last night when it accepted a bid of \$600 a year from Leo Arany whose bid was higher than that of Leo U. Eyerly, who has been manager since the port was established. The manager operates a flying school at the port, hence pays the city a lease fee.

MILWAUKIE, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—A grange resolution condemned efforts to organize drug stores or "other professions related to public health" today because "their service to public health might be impaired through union domination."

ASTORIA, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The newly organized United Fishermen of the Pacific elected Matt Barnovich, of San Francisco, executive secretary, with head-

quarters to be in Seattle. The organization is composed of the Purse Seiner's union of the Pacific and West Sea and Herring Fishermen's union, with a combined membership of 7,000.
