TRUCE HALTS ROGUE RIVER "MUD" WAR

GOLD BEACH, Jan. 6.—An order filed by Judge James T. Brand dismissed the suit brought by Curry county against 16 Rogue river mining operators, bringing a truce in a controversy begun more than a year ago.

Opponents, including sportsmen, contended the dumping of mine tailings in the Rogue destroyed fish life and threatened to silt up the stream bed.

The dismissal action followed word from Governor Charles Martin that a program to assure "all the fishing and mining interests."

Establishment of a fish hatchery and a revision of mining methods were involved.
