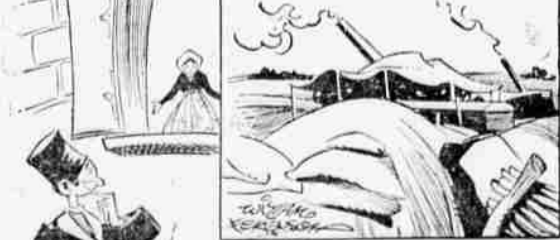


THIS CURIOUS WORLD
