

FASTING TO PROVE SOUL INDEPENDENCE

Episcopal Dean Trying to Show Inferior Need of Material Life.

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Jan. 12.—(AP)—The Rev. Fred Schmitz said today the Rev. Fred Schmitz, dean of St. Mary's Episcopal cathedral, is in the midst of an amazing fast undertaken "to prove that the soul is above the need of material life."

The paper said friends of the clergyman reported Dean Schmitz went on an exclusive orange juice diet December 23, 1936, and since January 2 of this year has eaten only a tiny communion wafer and drunk a sip of wine at the church's regular communion services, held three times a week.

The story said this diet "probably" had not been supplemented even by water.

It continued:

"Dean Schmitz is not an exhibitionist, is not trying to make an impression, wants no publicity and does not care what people think. While he has made no secret of his fast, he has not made any public statement about it."

"He is trying to prove that the soul is above the need of material life. He believes he can give up all material life and yet not die. If we get the theory correctly from his friends, he believes that he can live a wholly spiritual life in an earthly environment."

"The dean is a student of natural science, but he has a deep faith in the universality of all life. All life, he says, is electro-chemical. All energy comes from the cosmos. Man has always taken energy in the form of food derived from plants of other animals. These, however, derived their life-giving substance from the universal cosmic rays."

"The intake of life is simply a conversion of electro-chemical energy. Dean Schmitz believes he can, or is trying to see if he can, reach a state in which he takes his life energy directly from the original source. If he can attain such a state, he will be free of all early needs, entirely independent of the normal processes of life by which the human body eventually deteriorates into death."

SHANGHAI, Jan. 12.—(AP)—United States naval authorities announced today that efforts to save the American gunboat Panay, sunk by Japanese bombs in the Yangtze river Dec. 12, had been abandoned after the ship's safe and official papers had been recovered.

A salvage crew taken by the gunboat Gaby in the port above Nanking where the Panay went down announced the gunboat was damaged beyond repair and her hull was abandoned.

MADRID DISASTER CLAIMS 500 LIVES

Between 500 and 600 lives were today reported lost in a Madrid subway disaster—apparently a by-product of the Spanish civil war.

Details of the disaster were not directly forthcoming from Spain because of government censorship. So far as the 18-month-old war itself was concerned, government troops were said to have gained a half mile on the Teruel front in eastern Spain, a step toward driving insurgents from the outskirts of the city.

WARNING GIVEN ON TAX RETURN DATE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—(AP)—Ray T. Helvering, internal revenue commissioner, warned employers today they must file their federal unemployment insurance tax returns for 1937 by January 31.

After that date, penalties will be assessed for delinquency. Helvering said an extension of time was granted last year because of the pressure of the law but no extra time would be granted this year.

Employers of eight or more persons last year must pay 2 per cent tax on their payroll for unemployment insurance, but may deduct up to 50 per cent of similar taxes paid to the states. The state taxes, Helvering added, also must be paid before January 31 to be eligible as credits against the federal tax.
