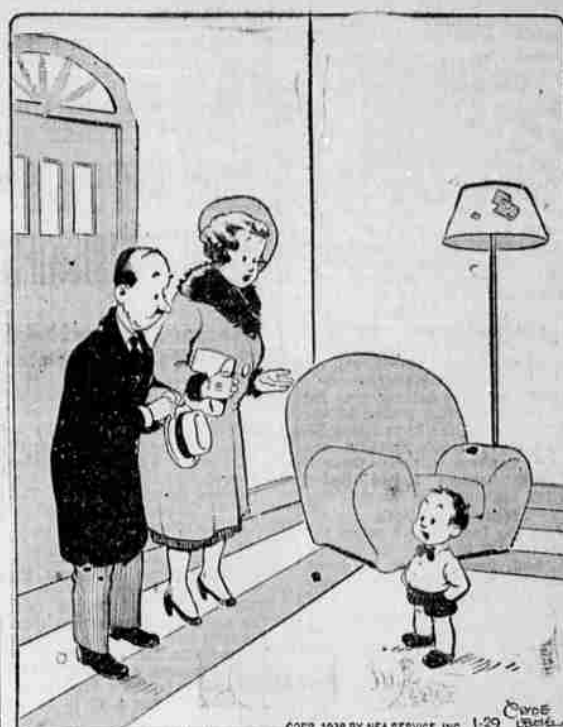
The bride is the daughter of Col. Julian L. Dodge, U. S. A., retired, an official of the American Rubber Manufacturing company, of Emeryville, Calif.

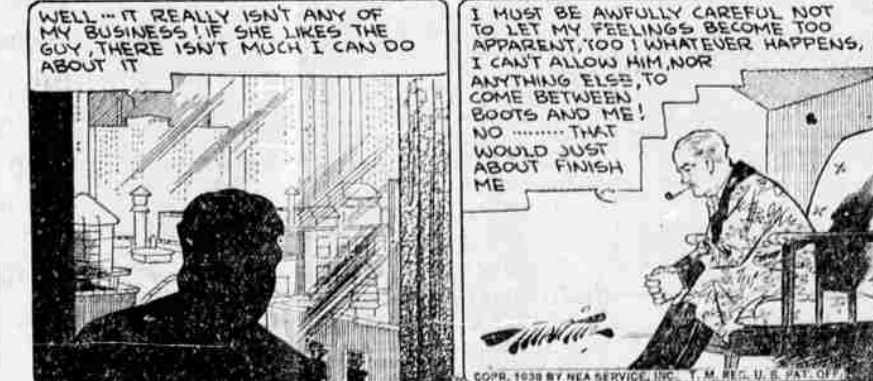
