Would Leave Home to Save Dog

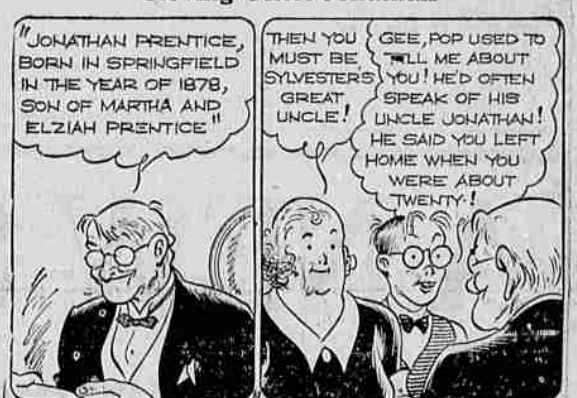

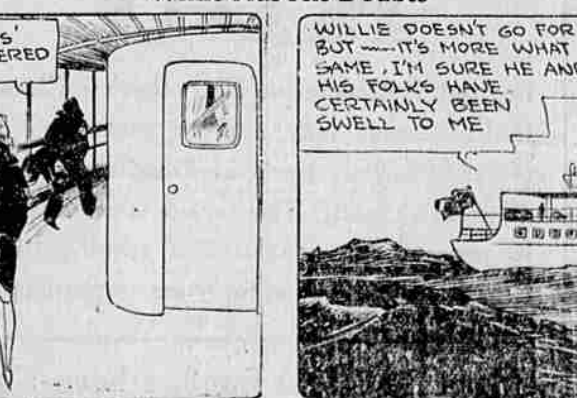

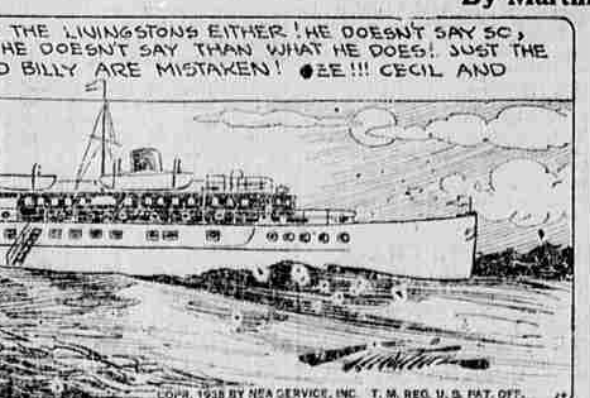
