Firemen were summoned from Reedsport after flames broke out, presumably from a defective chimney, but lack of a city water supply hindered the firemen.

A bucket brigade was formed to save the home of Mrs. Viola Hansen nearby. The Gearhart home was valued at \$1000 and its contents at \$2500.
