BANDON PLANS TAX CANCELLATION TEST

COQUILLE, March 1. (AP)—The Coos county court and Bandon city officials agreed yesterday to start a supreme court test suit to determine the legality of an enabling act authorizing the cancellation of delinquent property taxes in Bandon up to and including 1934.

The Bandon city council, schools and port district have already cancelled levies.

The county commissioners, who said they desired to settle the question of individual liability for the \$30,000 due, stated they would issue an order cancelling the taxes. The sheriff will refuse the city's application for a revision of the rolls. Municipal authorities will file a mandamus action in circuit court and the loser will appeal to the supreme court.

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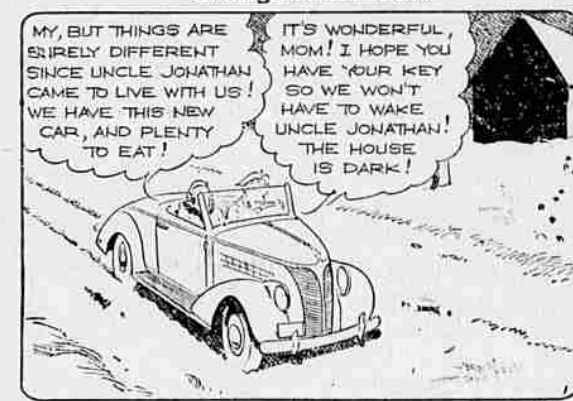
