FARMERS WARNED
ON ALFALFA SEED

Farmers who figure on planting alfalfa this spring should be careful as to the kind of seed purchased. This alfalfa seed crop harvested in 1937 is short, according to County Agent J. Roland Parker, and large quantities of southern-grown seed from Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Utah and southern California is being offered to farmers in the northern states. Varieties grown in these sections are not adapted to western Oregon nor to the Pacific northwest.

Southern grown seeds are often available at about one-half the price of the more hardy strains and it is a temptation to many farmers to purchase the cheaper seeds. Planting of such seed, however, is costly, as the stands are short lived and the quality of hay is poorer than that of the more hardy strains of alfalfa recommended for the Pacific northwest.

Farmers of Douglas county should endeavor to purchase Oregon-grown alfalfa seed when possible and if unavailable should look to Idaho and Montana as a source of good seed.

"FIREFLY" GEM OF
MELODY, DRAMA

DATED AT MELROSE

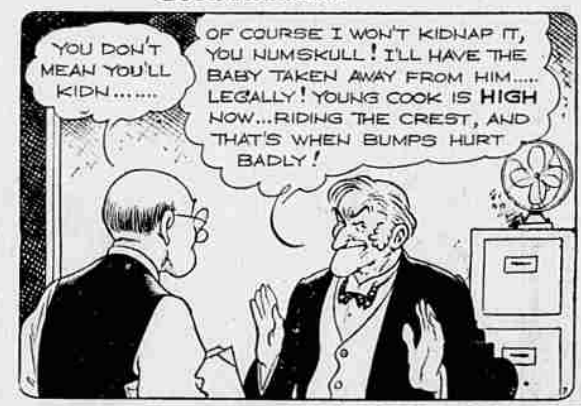
The group of entertainers which have been providing programs for granges under the auspices of the Roseburg Kiwanis club will go to Melrose grange tomorrow evening.

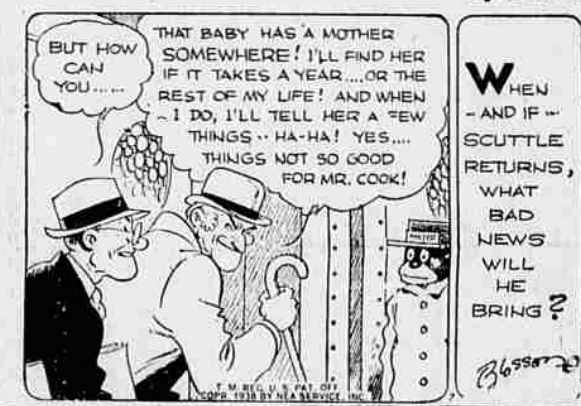
