

UTILITY PATRONS TO BE PROTECTED

Wallace Gives Assurance
on Bonneville Service
Via Private Firms.

SALEM, March 24.—(AP)—Public Utilities Commissioner N. G. Wallace said yesterday he would "insist that the ultimate consumers of Bonneville power receive every benefit possible" if the power is distributed by existing privately owned electric companies.

He pointed out that he would have no control over rates charged by proposed public utility districts and said "my department also would have no control over any indebtedness, either general obligation bonds, short-term debentures or utility certificates authorized by the present utility district law."

"Privately owned utilities must answer to this office for every rate and expenditure. The policy during this administration has been to equalize rural and city rates in every district."

Wallace said there is only one utility in Oregon which has a scale of rates penalizing farm customers in rural areas, and predicted that this company's rate structure would be made uniform before the end of the year.

Contradicting statements that rates charged by private utilities are based partly on the amount of outstanding capital stock, Wallace said rates are based only on the "reasonable value of property used and useful in rendering public service."

He added that this system has "given Oregon one of the lowest retail electric rates in the United States."
