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REGISTRATION AT O. S. C. INCREASES

CORVALLIS, March 25.—(AP)—Registration of 3581 students at Oregon State college by the third day of the spring term represented an 8 per cent increase since a year ago. The gain in the school of science was 21 per cent, agriculture 11 per cent and engineering and home economics 10 per cent.

The senior class is 23 per cent larger than last year and the sophomore class 15 per cent. Men students have increased 9 per cent and women 6 per cent.
