AUTO DEATH TOLL

SHOWS INCREASE

CHICAGO, April 1.—(AP)—Automobile traffic fatalities in the United States, for the fourth consecutive month, showed a decrease in February, the national safety council announced.

Following an all-time high in 1937 of 29,700 deaths, the council reported safer driving during February, 1937, and 20 per cent less than January of this year.

The council said this encouraging trend in traffic deaths meant a cumulative saving of nearly 1,800 lives since last November when the decline began. There were 2,180 deaths reported for February, 420 less than the corresponding period last year. Deaths in January were 520 less than in January, 1937.

Among state reporting, noticeable decreases for the two month period were Oregon, 38 per cent.

SCHERMERHORN OUT AGAIN FOR SHERIFF

MEDFORD, April 1.—(AP)—Gordon L. Schermernhorn announced his candidacy this week for the democratic nomination as Jackson county sheriff.

Schermernhorn, former sheriff who served a 13-month state prison sentence for alleged complicity in a ballot theft case here, said he sought vindication and to prove his innocence.

He will be opposed by Sheriff Syd I. Brown, incumbent.

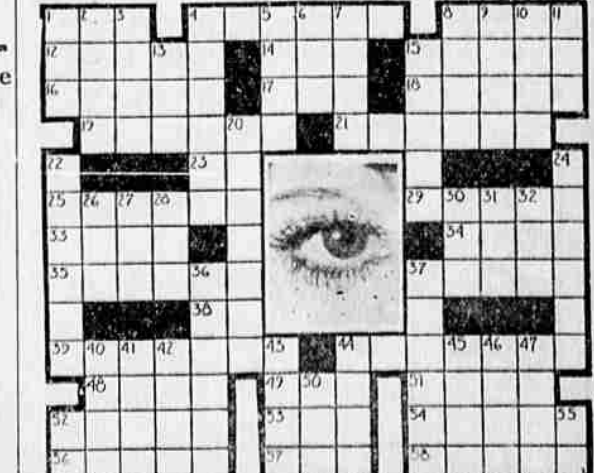

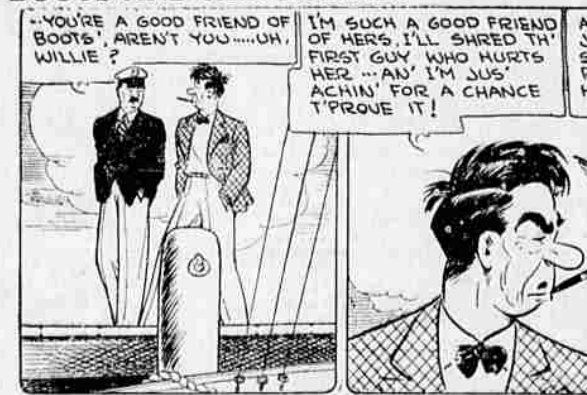

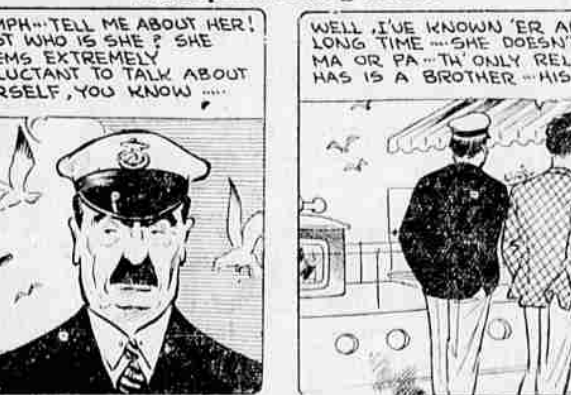
