

CATHOLIC WOMAN SCORES MRS. F. D. R.

BOSTON, April 26.—(AP)—Criticizing what she said were recent pronouncements by Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt on divorce and upon a motion picture film on the birth of a baby, Mrs. Charles Feehan, president of the League of Catholic Women today said "we have a right to expect a finer taste in the words of the wife of the president."

Addressing the Boston diocesan congress of Catholic women, Mrs. Feehan said Mrs. Roosevelt had stated that divorce was a recognized factor in American life and that the film entitled "The Birth of a Baby" "could not be harmful because it is honest."

"I believe it is most unfortunate, unfair and dangerous for the wife of the president of the United States to make pronouncements that give offense to a large part of our citizens," Mrs. Feehan said.

"It appears she is taking advantage of her position to inject that prestige into her personal views that do not at all reflect the common opinions of the people."

"I believe that we have a right

to look for a respectful regard for the decency and sanctity of life from the wife of a president of the United States and that she exert her influence, if use it she must, to elevate the tone and vision of society."

MATRICIDE OF 16 DRAWS 14 YEARS

CHICAGO, April 26.—(AP)—Teddy Danielson, 16-year-old "average" high school boy, was convicted of murder by a criminal court judge today and sentenced to 14 years imprisonment for fatally stabbing his mother in a quarrel over his truancy.

His father, who had stood by Teddy during the trial, stepped to the boy's side as Judge Cornelius J. Harrington read the sentence.

"Don't hold me, dad, I'm all right," young Danielson said.

He stood bewildered for a moment, clasping his hands, until a lawyer suggested he take a chair. Teddy was restless but perspiration was on his forehead.

In the crowded courtroom was a class of girls from Lacey Flower high school. Other high school students had heard the trial.

On the witness stand the boy professed inability to remember clearly just what had happened when he killed his mother.

K-FALLS TO TRY PARKING METERS

KLAMATH FALLS, April 26.—(AP)—Metered parking, a topic of enthusiastic discussion by the city council for the past two years, will become a reality here within the next 30 days.

Acting on authority of the council, Mayor Clifton Richmond has signed a contract with a Chicago firm for 450 parking meters similar to ones recently installed in Portland, at a cost of \$65 each, it was learned today.

The curbside nickel-eaters will be tried for a period of 12 months on the busiest downtown streets, with the manufacturing company receiving 75 per cent of the proceeds and the city retaining 25 per cent until the machines are paid for.

Thereafter, unless a public boycott or some other unexpected development meanwhile forces their removal, the mechanical cops will become the property of the city.

Under the arrangement contemplated here, the meters will dispense 21 hour-feet of parking space for 5 cents. They will be inoperative on holidays and after 6 p. m.

The city plans to use its 25 per cent of the revenue to hire extra police believed necessary to keep the system functioning.

WILLYS TO ISSUE NEW MODEL SEDAN

TOLEDO, Ohio, April 27.—Confirming rumors which have been prevalent in the automobile industry for the past few weeks, Willys-Overland Motors, Inc., made an important and dramatic move in the mass production field of motor car manufacturing here today, with the announcement of a new Willys Clipper five-passenger family sedan.

The announced low price places Willys still more definitely in a field of buyers where it is not in conflict with cars built by other manufacturers.

Development of the new model has been going on for several months and active production started a few weeks ago, when the Willys organization announced the return of 2000 additional men to the factory pay-roll.

EX-SHERIFF TERRILL OF JACKSON PASSES

MEDFORD, April 26.—(AP)—Charles E. Terrill, 70, a native son of Oregon, and former Jackson county sheriff, died Monday, following an illness of two years.

During his incumbency he was active in the early stages of the search for the DeAutremont brothers, now serving life terms in state prison for the Siskiyou tunnel quadruple murders and attempted train robbery in 1923.

Besides his widow, now precariously ill, Terrill is survived by two sons.

DR. KERR RESIGNS RESEARCH POSITION

CORVALLIS, Ore., April 26.—(AP)—The board of higher education yesterday accepted the resignation of Dr. W. J. Kerr, former chancellor, as director of research in production and marketing. It approved Chancellor Hunter's suggestion that Dr. Kerr continue in an advisory capacity and retain the title of chancellor emeritus.

The educator became president of Oregon State college in 1907 and chancellor in 1933. He received the title of chancellor emeritus in 1935.

The board deferred final consideration on establishing the office of agricultural and industrial marketing proposed by Dr. Kerr. Dr. Hunter said the former chancellor had "done a signal piece of work, unique in the west, in attacking the vital problems of marketing and production."

WOOL PRODUCTS TAB BILL IS APPROVED

WASHINGTON, April 26.—(AP)—The senate interstate commerce committee approved today a wool products labeling bill, and Senator Schwartz (D. Wyo.), author of the measure, said he thought congress would pass it at this session.

The bill requires manufacturers to label all wool products, shipped in interstate commerce so that the purchaser will know the exact percentage of virgin and re-worked wool and other fabric contents.

The federal trade commission would enforce the legislation.

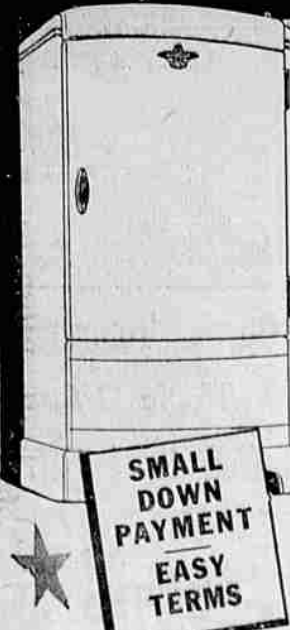
