Seized in Bogus Check Plot



As police all over America searched for 35 additional members of an underworld ring that plotted to pass \$200,000 in fraudulent travelers' checks, the five men pictured above were arrested and held for questioning. They are, top, George (Bugs) Moran, left, and Frankie Parker; and, lower left to right, Frank Quigley, Daniel Kelly and Robert Sexton. Arrested in Pittsburgh, Quigley, Kelly and Sexton allegedly had \$21,800 of the counterfeit checks in their possession. Moran and Parker were arrested in Chicago. Moran headed the old Chicago gang which was largely wiped out in the St. Valentine's Day massacre of 1929. Parker is a one-time whisky runner.

U. O. RESERVE OFFICER HEAD WILL RETIRE SOON



Col. E. V. D. Murphy, for four years head of the Reserve Officers Training Corps at the University of Oregon, has announced that he will retire July 31. Colonel Murphy has seen active service in the army for 40 years. He served during the World War in France and Germany about 12 months, and has also seen service in the Philippine Islands and Cuba. He came to the University of Oregon in 1934 from Hawaii. Colonel Murphy has been awarded two medals from the United States government, the Purple Heart, and a Campaign Badge. The French government awarded him a Croix de Guerre at the end of the World War.

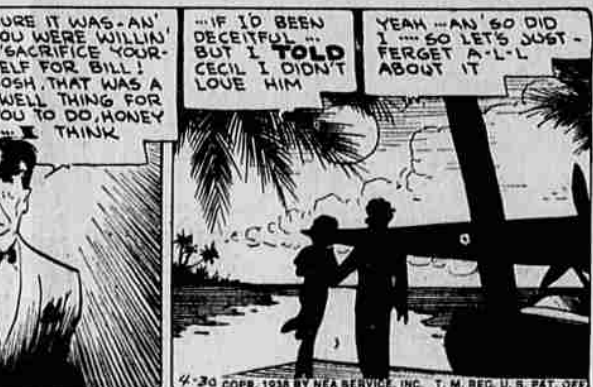
