FIRE PROTECTION
SEASON NEARINGPermits for Slash Burning,
Milling, Logging Needed
After This Week.

An urgent plea for public cooperation in fire protection during the coming summer was expressed by State Forester J. W. Ferguson in a statement issued at Salem. He called attention to the fact that the season of 1937 was the most favorable ever experienced by the state forestry department, and feels that this was largely due to public support and cooperation in fire prevention measures.

"Next Sunday, May 15th, marks the beginning of the closed season in Oregon," stated Mr. Ferguson, "and this date many of the provisions of the Oregon forest code that are seasonal in character become effective. These are all protective measures and designed to prevent forest fires and reduce fire losses to a minimum.

"Burning permits must be secured by all those who intend to use fire in or near forest land for the purpose of land clearing or the disposal of slash or other debris. These can be secured from the local warden or ranger. The closed season continues until December 31, unless terminated prior to that time through a proclamation by the governor.

Inspectors Available

"All logging, milling and other woods operations in western Oregon must secure permits from the state forester before starting or continuing activities. The necessary applications can be secured from the various inspectors who are in the field at the present time. Also, spark arresters and other fire prevention equipment must be in place on all machinery that is in use.

"The camper or other recreationist is also requested to see that the camp fire is entirely extinguished. Furthermore, no lighted cigarettes, lighted matches or other material is to be discarded on forest lands. "However, there are no restrictions at the present time relative to travel within the forests of the state and camp fire permits are not required. This action will not be taken until fire conditions become hazardous and it is felt that a closer check on forest fires is necessary. This usually occurs about the first of July."

MAYOR ENDORSES
AIR MAIL WEEK

Cooperation of Roseburg residents in National Air Mail week, to be observed May 15 to 21, inclusive, is urged in a proclamation issued today by Mayor A. J. Young. The mayor's proclamation follows: Whereas, the post office department at Washington is sponsoring National Air Mail week from May

15-21, inclusive, and Whereas, this is the twentieth anniversary of regular air mail service in the United States, and Whereas, I believe the citizenry of Roseburg has a lively interest in the development of air mail in our nation.

Now therefore, I, A. J. Young, mayor of the city of Roseburg, do hereby designate the week of May 15-21 as air mail week for all Roseburg and do call upon our people to make proper observance of this week by liberally patronizing the air mail and other-wise evidencing their appreciation of the efforts of the post office department to provide the necessary service for our state.

CLERKS, GROCERS
REACH AGREEMENT

PORTLAND, May 10.—(AP)—The retail clerks' union and the independent retail grocers reached a preliminary agreement last night in a three-month-old dispute over working conditions and wages.

Spokesmen for the two organizations said the union membership would consider a settlement on the basis of a 51-hour week, a Sunday and holiday closing and a 9 p. m. closing after November 1. The wages would remain unchanged for men but women would receive increases ranging from \$1 to \$2.50 per week.

Negotiations will continue until a formal agreement. The union asked the central labor council last night to place the Food Employers, Inc., on an unfair list because of a deadlock in the conferences for a new contract. The employer group represents chain stores and large food concerns.

BELGIAN POST GIVEN
TO ENVOY DAVIES

WASHINGTON, May 9.—(AP)—Joseph E. Davies, present ambassador to Russia, was nominated by President Roosevelt today to be ambassador to Belgium.

Davies will succeed at Brussels Ambassador Hugh Gibson, who is retiring from the diplomatic service. No successor to Davies at Moscow had yet been chosen.

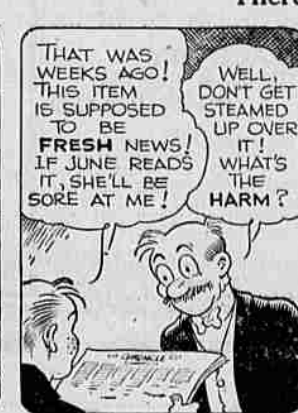

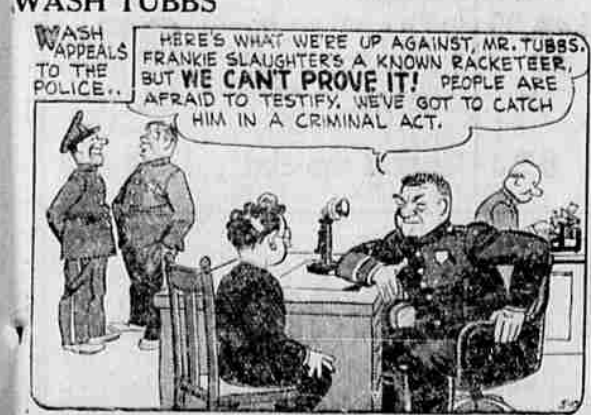
