The following is the radio address given Wed. eve over KRNR in behalf of Mr. McCulloch's candidacy:

RADIO ADDRESS
Voters of the State of Oregon: This is R. E. Masterson speaking in behalf of John W. McCulloch, candidate for Judge of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, Position No. 2. This position has been held by Henry J. Bean for five terms, and he is now a candidate for a sixth term.

Believing that Judge Bean has arrived at such an age that he should now retire, Mr. McCulloch has become a candidate against him.

Reason of the fact that some newspapers and organizations are recommending that the present incumbent be supported by you because he is the present incumbent, I am forced to tell you something that these supporters will not tell you, but are attempting to conceal from you. That is, that Judge Bean is now 84 years of age. If he is re-elected, he will be 85 years old before he begins his term, and will be 91 years of age before the end of his term.

It is for you to say, after considering these facts, whether or not the present incumbent should be re-elected for another six years. Having announced his candidacy, I believe you are entitled to know Mr. McCulloch's qualifications, and this information is placed before you. During the four years he was Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States, he was assigned to the legal work of the Bonneville Project. I am very proud to tell you that this work has been completed in a very satisfactory manner to the Government and to all concerned.

The Government of the United States, under a Republican Administration, and also under a Democratic Administration, has placed great confidence in Mr. McCulloch, and in his honesty, legal ability, and good judgment. The work done by Mr. McCulloch, and the confidence imposed in him, are worthy of your consideration when you select a successor to Judge Bean.

110-TIME BURGLAR GETS PRISON TERM

SAN FRANCISCO, May 18 (AP)—Robert Lane, 21, of Salem, Ore., was sentenced by Superior Judge Frank Deasy today to serve from one to 15 years in San Quentin prison on a burglary conviction.

Police Inspector Richard O. Hughes said Lane admitted 110 robberies in Portland, Ore., Los Angeles, San Francisco, Santa Barbara and other Pacific coast cities over a period of three years.

Lane said his father, Michael Lane, lived in Salem. Hughes said Lane served a term on the Multnomah county, Ore., rock pile for a robbery in 1937, and that Santa Barbara authorities waived a jewel robbery charge against him to enable Santa Francisco authorities to prosecute.

WORKING STUDENTS MAKE HIGH MARKS

Seventy Perct. at U. of O. Wholly or Partially Self-Supporting.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, May 18 — "Do students who work their way through college get as much of an education as those who don't?" An answer to that oft-repeated question was evidenced in a recent survey of working students at the university which showed that men who pay 50 per cent or more of their expenses are in the highest scholastic brackets.

Nearly 70 per cent, or 2,170 students, are either wholly or partially self-supporting, and of this group 741 men and 187 goods support themselves entirely during the school year at a variety of tasks. Grades of students in this group are generally of high ranking, the report said.

Miss Janet Smith, head of the university employment service, who made the survey, said that 1837 old jobs had been filled by students during the past year. Most of the self-supporting students work during the summer months at clerking or office jobs, in canneries, in harvest fields, or in restaurants, she said. During the school year jobs such as tending furnaces, moving lawns, gardening, repair work, caring for children, and waiting tables are the chief sources of income. Both men and women earn their living doing housework, she stated.

General opinion among students, Miss Smith declared, was that the ideal situation was for a student to work during the summer months and devote himself entirely to school during the rest of the year. At the opposite end of the wage earning scale are those who do not contribute at all to their own support. The group, which is in a minority, includes 644 coeds and only 287 men.
