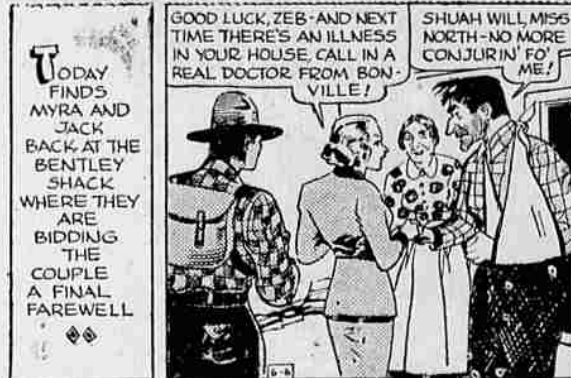

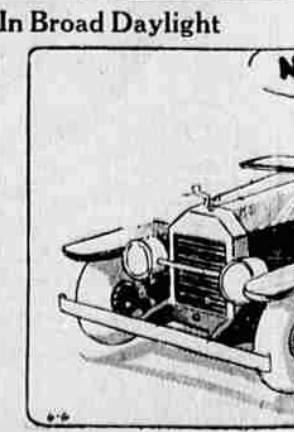

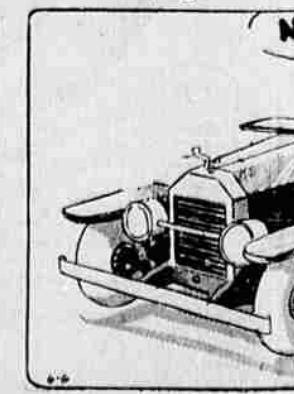

CANTALOUPE GAUGING POINTERS OFFERED

How to tell a "good" cantaloupe perplexes most consumer buyers. A cantaloupe to have the right flavor and sweetness must not be picked too green nor too ripe. There are telltale marks as to when a cantaloupe is picked, says W. R. Beattie, of the United States department of agriculture.

A cantaloupe picked too green will have a portion of the stem attached and the background color beneath the netting will be a pure green. One picked over-ripe or from a diseased vine will have a pale yellow or faded appearance, but if a slight golden color shows through the netting and the blossom end—opposite the stem end—is firm and does not show paleness, the consumer can be reasonably sure that the cantaloupe is good.

If the melon was picked full ripe no part of the stem will remain and there will be a clean scar. The presence of little globules of reddish brown sugar around the stem scar is a pretty sure indication that the melon is sweet.

Vine ripened melons—precooled before shipping—are now shipped across the continent. Introduction two years ago of No. 45, a mildew resistant variety, lessens the possibility of obtaining melons grown on diseased vines.

CONTROL OF PEA WEEVIL STUDIED

With practical control of the pea weevil on garden and canning peas a proved success, a study of more complete control on Austrian winter field peas which are grown for feed is being carried on this year by entomologists at the Oregon experiment station.

Growers who wish to protect their Austrian peas are advised to apply a rotenone dust mixture promptly after blooming starts. Such dust must contain at least 3-4 of one per cent rotenone to be effective, and is applied at the rate of from 20 to 25 pounds per acre, preferably with hooded dusters. As the weevil first infests the edges of the field, it is usually unnecessary to dust more than an outside strip 150 to 250 feet wide.

Many other factors besides dusting enter into the complete control of weevils in Austrian winter field peas, says Dr. Don C. Moto, station entomologist. Early harvesting, which allows for fumigating the crop while many of the weevils are
