Wheat growers and community committeemen interested in knowing the details of the crop insurance program are requested to attend the meeting. While wheat is not a major crop in the county, states B. F. Nichols, chairman of the county committee for the agricultural conservation program, farmers should be familiar with the provisions of the crop insurance program as it provides insurance against crop failure at a reasonable cost. Premiums may be paid in wheat or cash at the option of the producer.

RATES FOR WHEAT LOANS AWAITED

CORVALLIS, June 27.—(AP)—The Oregon State college AAA office announced it had received information on loans for wheat growers under the ever-normal granary plan but that rates had not yet been established.

Loans will be available on the 1938 crop under the terms of the 1938 farm act because of the large prospective crop and the low farm price on June 15. Wheat growers whose total acreage of soil depleting crops does not exceed 105 per cent of their soil depleting acreage allotment will be eligible for loans. Made must be stored in federally licensed or approved warehouses or in authorized farm facilities. Oregon is among the states where farm storage will be permitted. Grades of wheat which will be eligible for loans have been specified and in general mean that winter wheat grading No. 3 or better and spring wheat grading No. 2 or better will be eligible. Details of these requirements will be in the hands of all county committees in the near future.

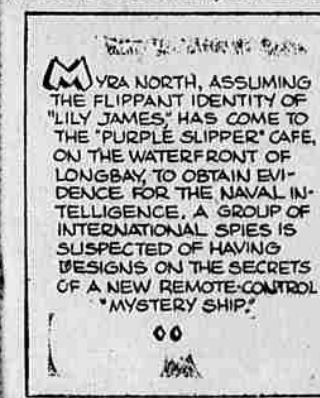

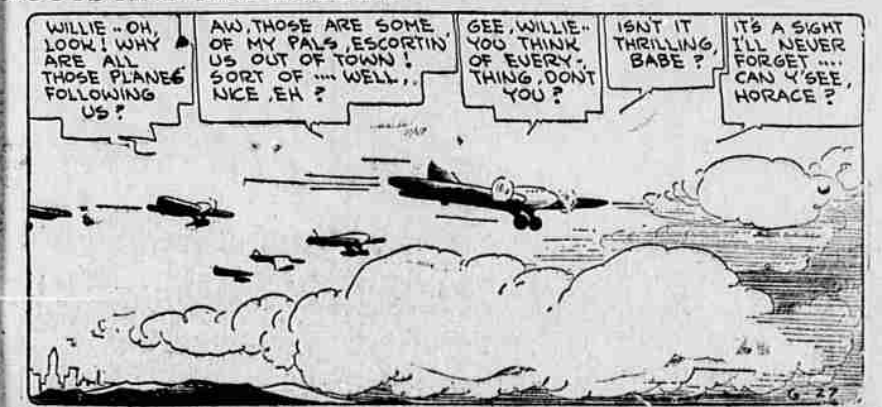

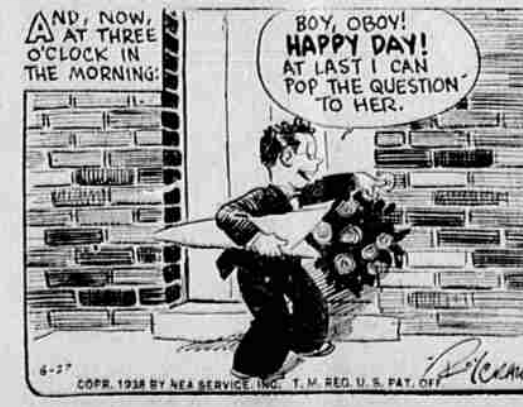
