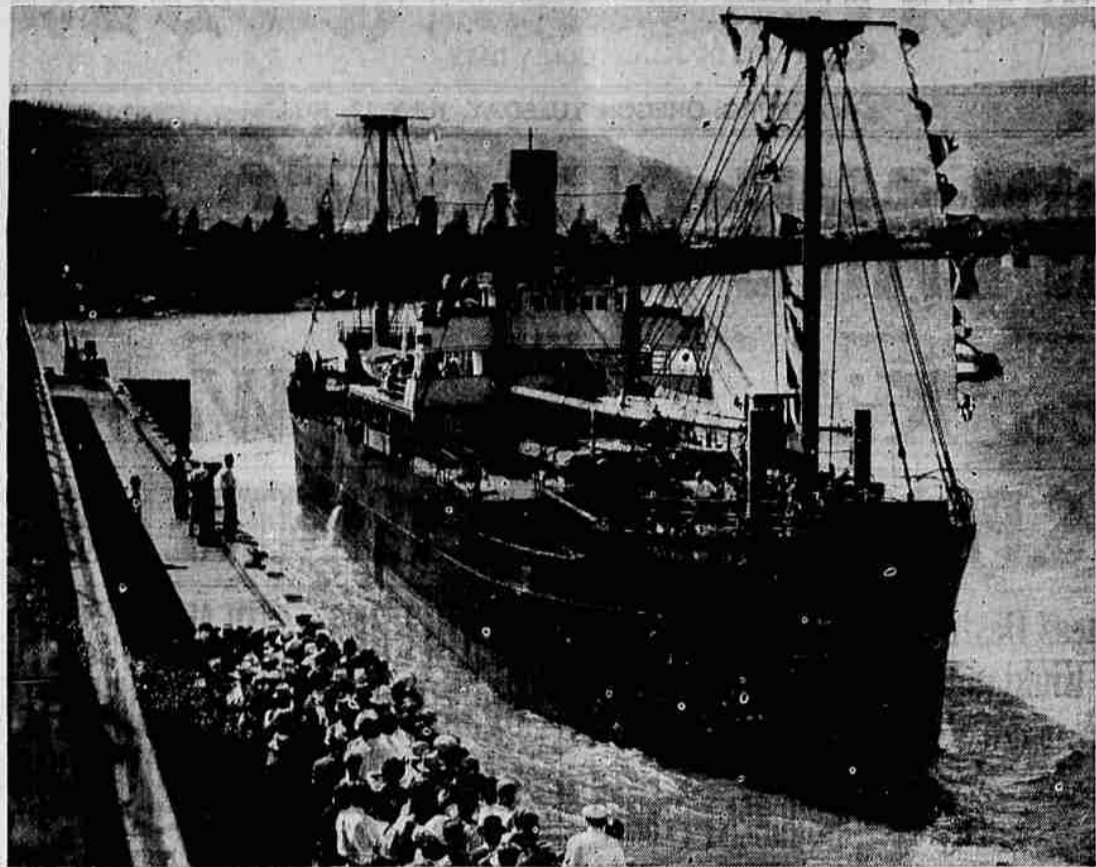
YONCALLA
