OREGON EVENTS FLASHED FROM WIRE SERVICE

TOLEDO, Ore., July 11.—(AP)—Following a conference with representatives of the industrial employees union, the C. D. Johnson Lumber corporation announced Sunday it would attempt to reopen its sawmill July 18 or 25, if orders can be obtained.

A wage reduction of 13 per cent for skilled and semi-skilled labor and 10 per cent for common labor down to the 18U minimum was agreed on. The mill and camp employed about 700.

SALEM, July 11.—(AP)—The state unemployment compensation commission has issued a warning against "chislers" who boast influence or power to obtain large jobless insurance checks for unemployed persons or to speed up payment in return for a fee.

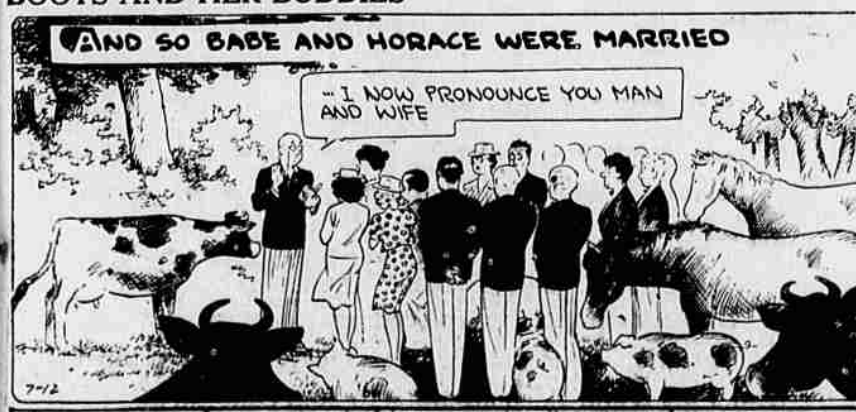
