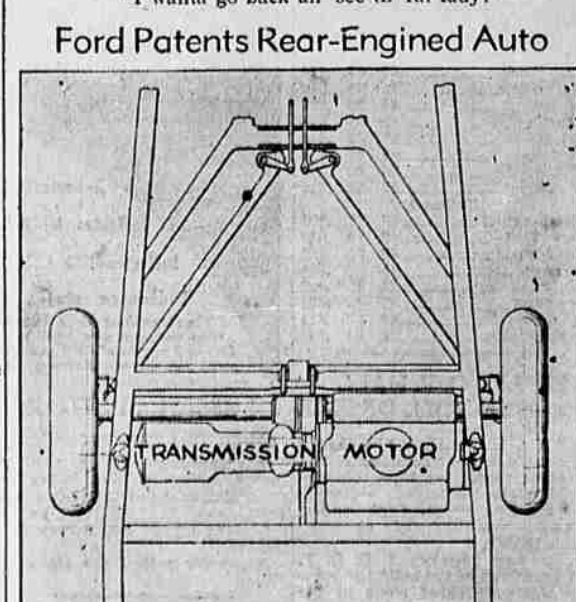

Ford Patents Rear-Engined Auto



Henry Ford's latest idea for moving forward in the auto industry is to move the engine backward. This drawing, submitted with Ford's application for a patent, shows the compact arrangement of a V-type, eight-cylinder motor with transmission, differential and other mechanical parts assembled about the rear axle. The arrangement is designed to provide a more direct drive from engine to wheels and permit a more unobstructed view of the road.
