TELEVISION PHONE

PATENT OBTAINED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—(AP)—A television telephone designed to make it possible to see a person while talking to him was patented today by Alexander McLean Nicolson of New York.

Nicolson said the system was primarily for inter-office communication in a single building. He suggested its use also for long-range radiotelevision communication.

A bell-shaped horn, resembling the early type of phonograph and radio loud speakers, contains television scanning devices for both sending and receiving, as well as a radio microphone and loudspeaker.

Present television systems, now being used experimentally in a

few large cities in various countries, are one-way methods of transmitting sound and moving images.

MURDER CHARGE

FUGITIVE NABBED

YAKIMA, Wash., July 27.—(AP)—Yakima deputy sheriffs today arrested Leland Bradley, alias George Watson, said wanted in South Dakota for murder and reported only uncaptured member of a bank robbery gang which staged a \$37,000 holdup in Sioux City last year.

Bradley was captured in a hay field about five miles from Brownstown. The arresting officers were forced to approach him through an open field and when told he was arrested Bradley countered with "you weren't fooling me a bit; I knew you were coming to pick me up."

In his cell in the county jail Bradley claimed intimate acquaintance with "Machine Gun" Kelly and others.

TENNESSEE VOTE

DRIVE UNDER FIRE

Conditions Said Pointing to U. S. Senate Contest No Matter Who Wins.

WASHINGTON, July 27.—(AP)—The senate campaign expenditures committee said today "every scheme and questionable device that can be used" for raising funds and influencing votes appeared to be "in full swing" in the Tennessee democratic primary.

After hearing a preliminary report from an investigator sent in to that state, the committee said in a statement conditions there pointed "sharply toward an election contest in the United States senate regardless of which group's candidate triumphs."

The committee also disclosed it had asked the postoffice department to investigate what it termed a misuse of the franking privilege by the farm security administration on behalf of former Governor Berry in his successful candidacy for the democratic senatorial nomination in South Dakota.

The committee sent Postmaster General Parley a copy of a 1934 press release referring to work done by Berry in 1936 when he was governor.

"These franked letters contain-

ed what your committee believes is a veiled, if not a direct, effort to influence votes in behalf of a candidate for public office in South Dakota," the committee told Parley.

Concerning Tennessee, Chairman Sheppard (D., Texas) said the committee hoped to send at least six additional investigators into that state at once.

SPECIAL ROAD TAX

REVIVAL FAVORED

ALBANY, July 27.—(AP)—Re-enactment of the law formerly permitting formation of special road tax levying districts was recommended in a resolution passed by county judges and commissioners

of district No. 5 of the Oregon Association of Counties here yesterday.

The officials asserted restoration of the law would facilitate road construction in areas where improvements would supply purely local needs for which general tax levies would not be justified.

Roads designed as outlets for timber only were specified among the types of improvements which the special road district law promoted.

The resolution will be submitted to the association's state executive committee when it meets at Portland Thursday.
