Although Mr. Ness left Roseburg to manage the Coos Bay division of the Mountain States Power company September 1, 1929, he did not move his family nor sell his home here. ORIGIN OF 'OREGON' PUZZLES SAVANTS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—(AP)—The Smithsonian institution's bureau of American Ethnology admits it can't fathom the origin of the name "Oregon."

Smithsonian's Dr. John P. Harrington said Saturday the name, which has baffled American etymologists for years, had three meanings none of which are pertinent.

One was "big-eared person," a second "to yank by the ear," a third referred to "sliced, dried fruit."

He said he thought the name was of Indian origin and got into English more than 150 years ago.

CARELESSNESS TOPS AUTO FATALITIES

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Sixty-seven per cent of the 15,400 pedestrians killed in motor car accidents in the United States last year were victims of their own carelessness the Greater New York safety council said.

A survey also showed, the council said, that 69 per cent of the 335,000 pedestrians injured in non-fatal traffic mishaps during the year were violating safety laws.

The council estimated the nation's 1937 motor vehicle death toll at 29,500.
