JOB RESTORING TOP DUTY, SPRAGUE SAYS

CORVALLIS, Aug. 2.—(AP)—Charles A. Sprague, republican gubernatorial candidate, told Benton county republicans yesterday that restoration of employment was the big job confronting Oregon and the entire nation.

"Jobs are the best form of social security," Sprague said. "Invigorate enterprise, end industrial and class strife. I believe in the right of labor to organize and bargain collectively but I favor lawful unionism."

"We need to revitalize the republican party in Oregon, build up an organization to be effective in public affairs and support free enterprise."

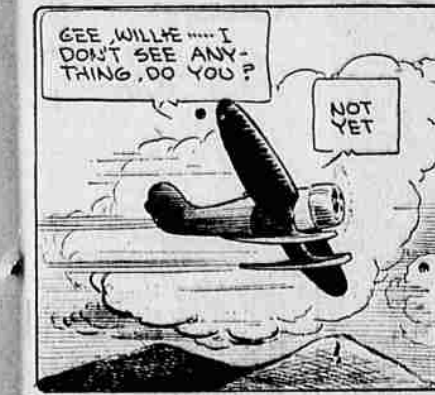

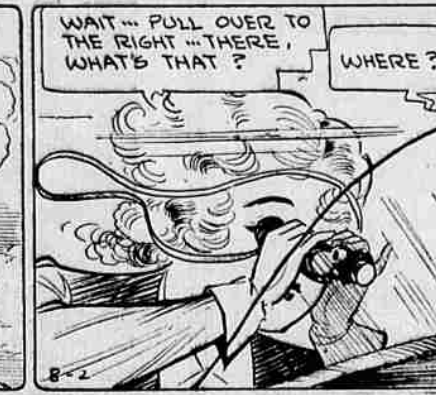

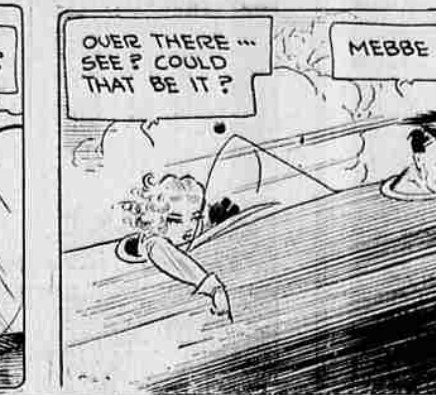
