D., in 1890. He was engaged in farming. MOTHER'S HIKE TO SAVE SONS ENDED

Rock Springs, Wyo., Aug. 5.—(AP)—Mrs. Margaret Britte, 66, whose hitch-hiking trip to Washington to obtain a presidential pardon for her two sons convicted of slaying three California men ended here Tuesday, was en route to her home at Sacramento today.

Red Cross officials placed Mrs. Britte on a westbound train last night and, consigned her to the care of Horace Fry, Sacramento attorney, who has been defending her sons, John and Coke Britte.

Convinced her sons were "absolutely innocent," Mrs. Britte left Sacramento two weeks ago and was on her way to try to see President Roosevelt in the hope of obtaining a pardon.

Tourists who had picked her up in Utah turned her over to Red Cross officials here Tuesday when she suffered from the 8,000-foot altitude.

John and Coke Britte were convicted of killing two Shasta county, Calif., officers and a third man in August, 1935.

They are under sentence of death.
