REALTY SCHOOL IN OREGON PLANNED

NORTH BEND, Aug. 10.—(AP)—Oregon real estate dealers adopted yesterday a state higher educational extension program presented by Dean Alfred Powers whereby courses will be made available throughout the state.

Latest trends in real estate work will be studied in the courses, available to business men and others. Realtors will suggest the subject matter and experts in state schools under Powers will map definite lessons.

The state-owned radio station at Corvallis, KOAC, will cooperate. Similar extension courses have been given in Portland.

Dean Powers said classes, correspondence and radio would be utilized, with sponsors seeking to reach every possible community. Basic study in real estate and a course in appraisals will be included.
