BOWKER SPEAKS ON TAXES AND LANDS

A summary of the tax and public land situation in Douglas county was presented to the Roseburg Rotary club at its regular Thursday luncheon by Morris Bowker, clerk of the county court.

The assessed valuation of the county has decreased about 10 per cent in the past 10 years, due mostly to tax foreclosures removing lands from the tax rolls, the speaker said. During the same period, he pointed out, the cost of county government has been decreased 13 per cent. He also stated that of the total tax levied during the 10-year period, 22 per cent is on the books as unpaid.

Bowker also detailed the public land ownership in the county, illustrating with a colored map the

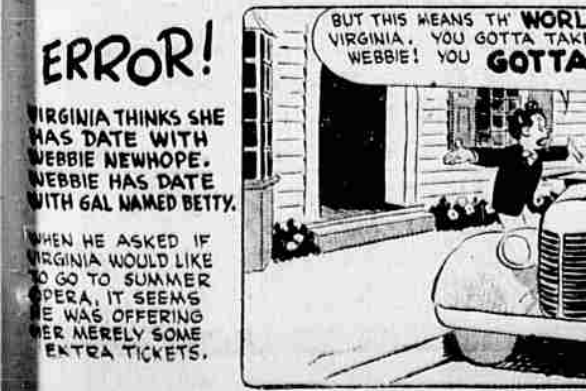

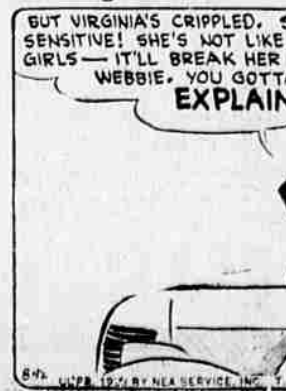
