U. S. HELPS 22,000 NEEDY IN OREGON

PORTLAND, Aug. 17.—(AP)—More than \$250,000 a month is being spent in Oregon by the federal government for aid of the aged, dependent children and the blind, government officials said today.

About 22,000 persons are being aided and since the first grant in April, 1936, nearly \$5,000,000 in federal funds has been distributed.

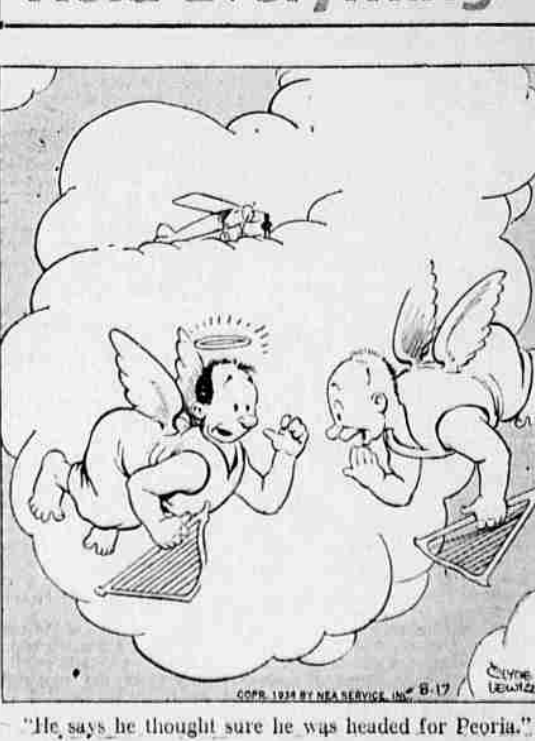
