

VFW URGES ACTION ON HARRY BRIDGES

Encampment Asks Prompt Prosecution of Pacific Coast C.I.O. Czar.

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 24—(AP)—The Veterans of Foreign Wars, in national encampment here, adopted a resolution today demanding prompt prosecution of Harry Bridges, San Francisco maritime union leader of the C.I.O.

The resolution in part read: "Whereas Harry Bridges has been charged with fomenting strikes, labor racketeering, conspiracy to cripple our merchant marine, and continued disobedience to the constituted courts of our nation . . .

"And whereas trial of said charges has been repeatedly continued, and now appears to have been indefinitely postponed, . . . be it resolved that demand be made upon the department of labor to proceed forthwith in prosecution of the charges . . . to the end that if he is innocent he be exonerated and if on the other hand he is guilty he be deported forthwith."

Neutrality Policy Backed

The encampment today endorsed the neutrality policy of the Roosevelt administration and recommended maintenance of an adequate navy and adoption of legislation to equalize the "profits and burdens of war."

The recommendations were included in the report of the V.F.W. committee on national defense which was approved by the delegates.

Veteran participation in the United States employment service was described by W. Frank Persons of the U. S. department of labor. He said during the past five years the employment service had provided 2,100,000 jobs for veterans.

In his annual report, Command-in-Chief Scott P. Squires of Oklahoma City recommended continuation of the organization's youth activities and its battle against "subversive forces."

Squires presented to Everett Reniker, 19, of Joplin, Mo., the annual Veterans of Foreign Wars award of \$300 in cash and a gold medal for outstanding boy scout service.

The military order of the Coolie veterans' fun-making organization, elevated Patrick H. Houde of Lackawanna, N. Y., to the post of supreme commander.

BABY BIRTH FILM IS GRAPHIC LESSON

Public showing of the widely publicized full-length film "The Birth of a Baby," which presents for the first time through the medium of the motion picture the story of "antennity," will start at the industrial theatre today.

The film was made under the auspices of the American Committee on Maternal Welfare, Inc., which is composed of representatives of sixteen medical and welfare groups including the Section on Obstetrics and Gynecology of the American Medical Association, American College of Surgeons, Children's Bureau and the U. S. Public Health Service.

Telling the story of the lives of three women—a mother, a woman about to become a mother, and a younger girl—"The Birth of a Baby" is an important part of the current campaign for health education, not only for the mothers and fathers of the nation, but for the adolescent boys and girls in our schools and homes.

Those who have seen the picture call it a powerful lesson. It has been shown privately to groups of youth between the ages of fifteen and seventeen, and the committee reports it made a profound impression on them in that it increased respect for motherhood and the responsibility of bearing children.

Officials of the Boy Scouts, Federal Council of Churches and Young Women's Christian Association as well as Katharine Lantow of the Children's Bureau, U. S. department of labor, have personally approved the film for public showing. The State Medical associations of New York, South Dakota, Ohio, Iowa, Virginia, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Indiana, and many

other state medical associations as well as public health, nursing, welfare and civic groups have also approved it for public showing.

Five of the country's leading obstetricians, especially designated by the American Committee on Maternal Welfare, fans to bring the dream of this picture to reality, approved the script and hovered over the set during the filming.

Restrictions Unique

They also laid down the stringent restrictions under which "The Birth of a Baby" is shown here and in all other communities.

These restrictions are unique in the motion picture industry and include a prohibition against showing another feature picture on the same bill, or any news reel or short that has not been approved in writing by the American Committee on Maternal Welfare.
