

FIREMEN START TOY REPAIR JOB

Annual Gifts to Children
for Christmas Planned

The Roseburg Fire department announced today that it already has started work on the collection, repair and renovation of toys for Christmas relief. The fire department members will prepare donated toys for distribution by proper agencies to children in needy families during the holiday season, it was reported.

Work of minor repairs, painting, etc., will be conducted at the fire hall, while work necessitating manufacture of parts will be done by the several members who have home workshops.

The American Legion auxiliary, it is stated, has offered cooperation and will provide old clothing, etc. The New Service laundry and the Imperial Cleaners have volunteered to collect toys from donors and deliver them to the fire hall.

The department requests that persons having worn, outgrown or broken toys either deliver them to the fire hall or call the firemen's club, phone 163, and arrangements will be made for collection.

part of a dramatic build up to put blame on Germany should the minority negotiations break down in Czechoslovakia.

Border Given War Aspect
Chancellor Hitler continued his inspection of Germany's border fortifications, while Czech motorized units of the French army began maneuvers close to the German border. One unconfirmed report said France might keep her troops in the field as long as Germany keeps her estimated 2,000,000 men under arms.

The Czechoslovak cabinet met to discuss the long-awaited "new plan" to meet the demand of the sudeten Germans for territorial autonomy. Police in the sudeten German areas were ordered to guard against a recurrence of brawls that could be magnified to serious proportions.

A dozen bar room fights occurred last night and officials said similar incidents would cause grave concern.

Peace Plan Studied
Czechoslovakia's military leaders, grappling with their particular phase of the war or peace problem, discussed a new plan to meet the sudeten demand for territorial autonomy. This was understood to offer something similar to Switzerland's government by cantons.

Vincent Rutenman, British unofficial mediator in the Czechoslovakian impasse, hoped to get the attitude of Konrad Henlein, the sudeten German chief, or rather of Hitler, Henlein's backer, toward this play today or tomorrow.

Neither Hitler nor his lieutenants gave any sign they might consider the new Czechoslovakian proposals. And the Nazis, in their controlled press and by official protest to Prague, assailed the Czechoslovak government with intensified bitterness.

From the Balkans came support for what Britain has been trying to impress on Hitler—that he can not count on any central European ally, with the possible exception of Hungary, if war comes.

Officials of Rumania and Yugoslavia, while denying they had given any warning to Germany, indicated their sympathies were with Czechoslovakia, with whom they are linked in the little entente.

"More Power Than Govt."
One witness, Dies wrote, testified he had seen Bridges pay a \$2 assessment and membership dues to the communist party. Another, he continued, said Bridges' interest and concern leaned toward the communist movement rather than toward the men he was supposed to represent in the maritime union.

"This witness said 'Dies' letter went on, 'he asked Bridges whether or not he would go against the wishes of the president of the United States and Bridges said, 'to hell with the president of the United States,' and Bridges further said he had more power behind him than the government of the United States, and before three years he would be in a position to prove his statements.'"
