

COMMUNITY FAIRS DRAW BIG CROWDS

**Sutherland Event Will Be
Featured by Concert
by Roseburg Band.**

Community fairs are this week drawing large crowds from all parts of the county, following the successful event last Saturday and Sunday at Canyonville.

The East Douglas fair was held yesterday at Glendale and drew a large attendance, not only from the immediate community, but from Roseburg and other parts of the county. The exhibits provided one of the largest displays in recent years, the fruit and vegetable showing being unusually large, particularly in view of the dry growing season.

Interest today centered in the West Douglas fair in progress at Lookingglass.

The Central Douglas fair will be held Friday at Sutherland and will continue over Saturday.

FIRE-HIT VESSEL BEACHED AT ALASKA

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, Sept. 1.—(AP)—The Alaska Transportation company's 660-ton freighter, Chatham, beached yesterday after fire swept her engine room and superstructure while she was loading cargo, was two-thirds submerged early today.

The flames, brought under control late last night by a fire boat and a coast guard cutter, continued to smolder.

The Alaska Pacific Salvage company was operating pumps aboard the craft in an effort to lower the water but observers said the work seemed hopeless. With her bow ashore, the Chatham's stern was in 55 feet of water.

Ship's officers placed the damage unofficially at \$30,000.

The blaze was started by a backfire from a boiler in the engine room.

Chief Engineer Herbert Woods, overcome by smoke and suffering minor burns, was taken to a hospital. Second Engineer George Bennett and Fireman James Morris.

FOREIGN LUMBER MUST BE MARKED

SEATTLE, Sept. 1.—(AP)—Effective today, foreign lumber must be marked to indicate the country of its origin to be admitted through the United States customs.

The West Coast Lumbermen's association, pointing out the new set-up, said an order was issued by the treasury department to collectors of customs on August 22 requiring such marking.

"The order applies to all lumber imported from all foreign countries and also covers sawed timbers," officials said.

"The association has sought this action by the government for several years. The Domestic Originals act requires lumber used in public construction to be a United States product."

"Lumbermen have asked for the marking of foreign lumber to aid enforcement of the act, to the end that the American industry and its employees may be given greater protection in obtaining benefits from the new PWA building program, as well as from all other construction work by the various federal agencies."

An association statement said the new order was based on section 3 of the customs administrative act of 1938, an amendment to section 304 of the tariff act of 1930.
