ELEANOR SMITH TO GET SANITY HEARING

SEATTLE, Sept. 29—(AP)—A sanity examination of Mrs. Mary Eleanor Smith, accused in the 19-year-old disappearance of James Eugene Bassett, was ordered by Superior Judge Howard M. Findley today.

Mrs. Smith, former inmate of the state penitentiary, and her son, De-rasto Earl Mayer, who is serving a life term in prison as an habitual criminal, were charged with murder in connection with the disappearance of Bassett in 1928.

Warren Hardy, Mrs. Smith's attorney, opposed the move, made by County Prosecutor B. Gray Warner. Mrs. Smith was driven insane temporarily, Hardy argued, and in this condition confessed she and Mayer slew Bassett, but now she is sane.

Hardy insisted the "clever designs" of Mrs. Margaret Padelford Fawcett, another prison inmate, caused Mrs. Smith to become temporarily deranged. The attorney said Mrs. Fawcett sought a pardon for her part in reopening the Bassett case.

Warner said Mrs. Smith signed a statement that she and Mayer killed Bassett for his automobile, then disposed of his dissected body, parts of which never have been found. She pleaded "not guilty by reason of insanity" to the murder charge.

Date for the sanity hearing will be announced after the commission is selected, Warner said.

MEDFORD COUNCIL SEEKS RE-ELECTION

MEDFORD, Sept. 28—(AP)—Filing for municipal officials at the November 8th election closed late Tuesday, with Mayor C. C. Furnas, Recorder M. J. Alford, and Treasurer Gus Samuels seeking re-election. Barring write-ins, there will be no contests for city offices.

Councilmen who filed for re-election are N. M. Hogan, L. J. Schade, G. H. Hermand and Thomas Roseberry. J. Frank Rinehart, filed from the fourth ward, where a vacancy exists.
