mountains" dread Rocky mountain spotted tever—were recorded this year.

A steadily dwinding number of infections and deaths in the area where the disease has been most severe during the past decade was shown today in survey by the Associated Press.

Only one of nine states—Idaho—reported more deaths this year than last and no state had nearly as many fatalities from the fever this year as were reported for the year when the disease was most severe.

The principal reason for the decrease in infections, health authorities said, was increased immunization with the spotted fover vaccing developed and manufactured by the United States public health service in its Hamilton, Mont, laboratory.

To date this year, the nine states included in the survey—New Mexico, Idaho, Colorado, Nevada, Ulah, Oregon, Wyoming, Washinzton and Montana—have had 174 increase of spotted fever 33 deaths in 1927, the figures were 232 and 26.

Oregon Victims Fewer There were four deaths in Oregon this year compared with (ive in 1927, The state bareau of public health reported 37 cases this year against 48 last.

Public health service officials listed only 358 cases in the United States last year after reports had been received from every state but Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Michly charge.


