LOS ANGELES, Nov. 15.—(AP)

in's warning yesterday women in his courtroom must dress like wo-men. He told her she could not take the witness stand because she was wearing gray-green slacks and a flamboyant yellow sweater. He told her to come back today, wear-

ing a dress.

Miss Hulick came back, took the Miss Hulick came back, took the witness stand and teatified against two negra#s charged with robbing her house. Judge Guerin ignored her as she opened her coat and displayed the slacks and sweater. When she finished her teatimony the bailiff led her to the prisoners' bench, and there she heard the court order her to jail. Judge Guerin explained his objection to slacks and "wild sweaters," by saying witnesses and prisoners alike paid more attention to Evomen thus attired than to the court.
