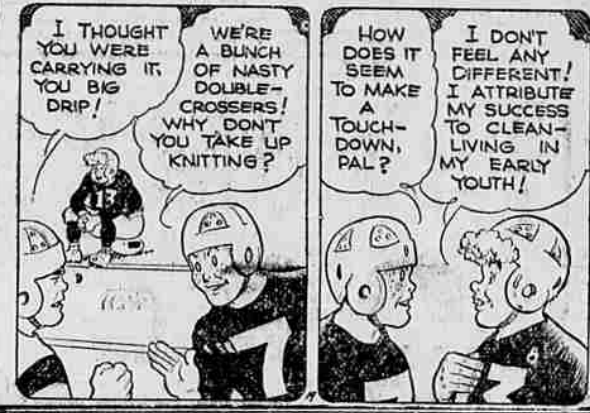

MANIACAL KILLER OBJECT OF SEARCH

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19—(AP)—Police convinced their quarry was a homicidal maniac, searched suburban northwest Washington and nearby Maryland today for clues to the identity of a gunman blamed for the slaying of two persons and the wounding of two others. Five suspects were held. All the attacks have occurred within a week. Peter F. Murray, 50, a deputy WPA foreman here, was killed and his companion, Mrs. Edna L. Brown, 40, was wounded Thursday night. Mrs. Brown said they were motoring to Silver Spring, Md., when a man jumped onto the running board of the car and demanded money. He opened fire, she said, after Murray surrendered his wallet containing \$5. Ballistic experts said the shots were fired from the same weapon used by a man who wounded John G. Clements, 23, a week ago, and killed Edward Roper, 31, Negro, a day later. In each of these instances, the victim was in an automobile with a woman companion. Except in the case of Murray and Mrs. Brown, police said the gunman made no effort to rob. This, they surmised, indicated his sole purpose was to kill. In each attack he fired his gun until it was empty. A footprint at the shooting scene, Murray's wallet and fingerprints on the car provided the only clues.
