Portland, Jan. 12—(AP)—United States District Attorney Donough said today that deportation proceedings against the Fred Gong family, Portland Chinese, had been dropped. Donough said the government found defects in Gong's certificate of admission in 1922 were not sufficient to permanently bar him and his family from the United States. Since arriving in this country, the Chinese barber and his wife had four children, who are American citizens. Deportation of the parents and an older son, now an Albany college student, would have broken the family, Donough said. Several thousand Oregon citizens petitioned the attorney general and the labor department in an effort to gain permanent residence here for the family.

## GUAM PROJECT MAY STIR HOT DEBATE

Fortification Would Prop Insular Defenses But Irritate Japan.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12—(AP)—Naval plans for immediate fortification of the island of Guam, become the focal point for a furious congressional debate over President Roosevelt's \$52,000,000 defense program.

Well-informed legislators said today the project pointed toward a complete reorientation of American policies in the far east.
