BETTER DEFENSES FOR CANADA URGED

OTTAWA, Jan. 12.—(Canadian Press)—The governor-general of Canada, Lord Tweedsmuir, opening the dominion's parliament today, declared: "Conditions of modern warfare make it imperative that Canada's defenses be materially strengthened."

Sketching in broad outline a program to be presented by the Dominion government for unemployment relief, farm aid and other problems, Lord Tweedsmuir said a vigorous policy would be pursued "to safeguard the country from the dangers of attack," with special emphasis on air defenses.

New trade agreements linking the United States with both Canada and the United Kingdom, signed Nov. 17, taken together "constitute a constructive contribution toward a betterment of world conditions," he declared.

LAW OFFICERS TO MEET IN ROSEBURG

Law enforcement officers of the southern Oregon district will meet at the Umpqua hotel in Roseburg, Jan. 21, it was announced today. The meeting will be given over to a study of law enforcement problems, and to entertainment.

ALASKA 1938 GOLD YIELD IS 21 MILLION

SKATTLE, Jan. 11.—(AP)—The gold "flood" from Alaska reaching the assay office last year approximated \$21,000,000, nearing the all-time high of \$26,000,000 at the turn of the century, George L. Swarney, assayer-in-charge, said today. In all, precious metals valued at \$25,700,000, an increase of \$1,700,000 over 1937, were handled from Alaska, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Oregon.
