

RHS QUINTET TO BATTLE COQUILLE

Undefeated Indians Likely to Be Favored to Win on Foe's Floor.

Coch Jim Watts' Indian cagers, undefeated in seven straight starts, left today for Coquille where they will engage the strong Red Devil quintet tonight at 7:45 o'clock in their first conference game away from the local wigwam. The contest will mark the opening district No. 8 engagement for the hosts in their new \$40,000 gymnasium.

The Roseburg five, by virtue of their 27-21 victory over North Bend high school here a week ago and the fact that the Bulldogs already hold a win over Coquille, will probably open the contest the favorite despite the fact that the league leaders are playing in strange surroundings with a team weakened somewhat by sickness.

All-conference guard, George Sanders, and Earl Ward, sophomore forward, have both been out of school nursing bad colds, but Coach Watts expects them to be ready for play by game time.

Ward Will Start

No shifts in the starting lineup are contemplated by the Indian mentor other than Ward, who will probably get the opening nod in the forward position as a result of his fine play against the Bulldogs. The starting quintet will likely see Ward and Church, forwards; Parrott, center; G. Sanders and Finlay, guards. If Ward and Sanders still feel the effects of the layoff, Laurence and V. Sanders will replace them.

Coch "Spike" Leslie's Red Devils have been tabbed by Coos county cage followers as one of the two strongest quintets in the district, North Bend being the other. Not much is known of the Red Devils five other than that they have a number of returning lettermen and capable reserves on hand. Last Tuesday night the hosts tumbled Myrtle Point, 21-20, for their first victory on their new court.

The complete Indian traveling squad is composed of G. Sanders, Ward, Finlay, Church, Parrott, V. Sanders, Horgan, Atterbury, Laurence, Puckett and Shoemaker, manager.

Tonight's game will be broadcast through station KRNR by remote control from station KOOS, Marshfield, starting at 7:30 o'clock.

REFUSES MILLION FOR MAN O' WAR

NEW YORK, Jan. 13.—(AP)—At the age of 22, 19 years after he quit the turf with the most notable record in American racing history, Man O'War continues to make news. Last week his owner, Samuel D. Riddle, turned down an offer of \$1,000,000 for him. It was by far the largest offer ever made for a race horse.

The offer came, appropriately enough for so huge a bid, from Louis B. Mayer, Hollywood film producer. Riddle revealed yesterday. It was flatly refused, for Riddle had vowed never to part with his famous runner and sire and had just completed arrangements setting up a trust fund for the son of Fair Play-Mahubian.

The trust fund will continue Man O'War in his pleasant regal state if Riddle and Mrs. Riddle die before he does, and makes provision for his burial in the same plot with his sire and dam.

Mayer's offer was a surprising one—at 22 Man O'War's value as a sire has declined—but there seems little doubt it was sincere. Since entering the racing game, Mayer has bought heavily, purchasing among others William Woodward's Peerless, Oregon Thoroughbred's Magic Hour (for \$25,000), and Thomas Hitchcock's Osnabaw. He has entered them in the big California stakes this winter and is training the \$79,000 worth of yearlings purchased at the Saratoga sales last summer.

ACCIDENTS FEWER ON FRIDAYS, CLAIM

HARTFORD, Conn., Jan. 13.—(AP)—Friday the 13th is anything but an unlucky day, the Travelers Insurance company says.

As a matter of fact, company records show, the last time the 13th of the month fell on a Friday, in May, 1938, fewer accidents were reported than for any day during the month.

In general fewer accidents occur on Fridays than any other day of the week, the company said. Saturday is the worst of the seven days.
