LATER SEASON FOR DUCKS PROPOSED

PORTLAND, Jan. 13.—(AP)—The state game commission renewed its attempt today to obtain a later duck season through coordinated action with Washington and California.

The commission ordered Supervisor Frank B. Wire to contact Washington and California departments in an effort to make a united plea to the United States biological survey for a season about two weeks later than the present October 15 to November 28, period in the region west of the Cascade mountains.

The Washington sportsmen's council wrote to the commission here that best birds failed to arrive until the end of the present season and their protected status resulted in considerable crop destruction. Wire said the situation in western Oregon was similar.

The commission said the interior department had accepted an offer of \$2500 for 30 to 45 acres of In-
