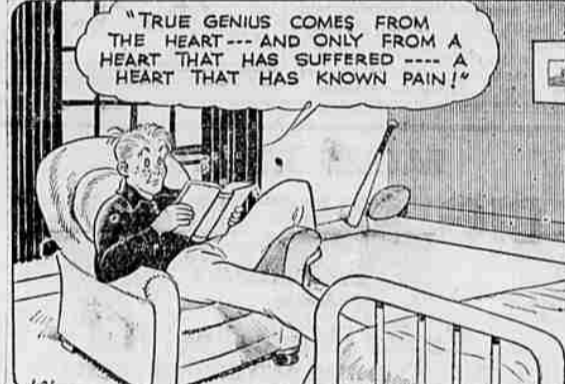

Nazi Slayer's Kin Sentenced

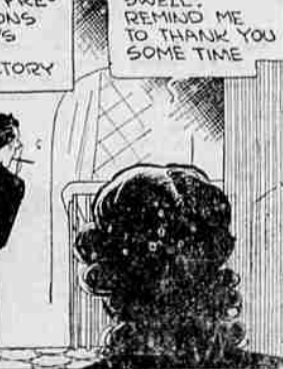

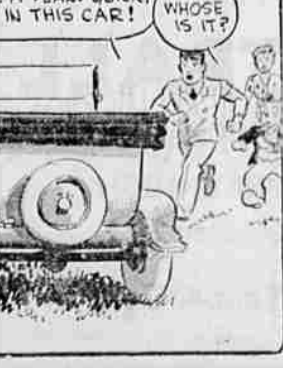

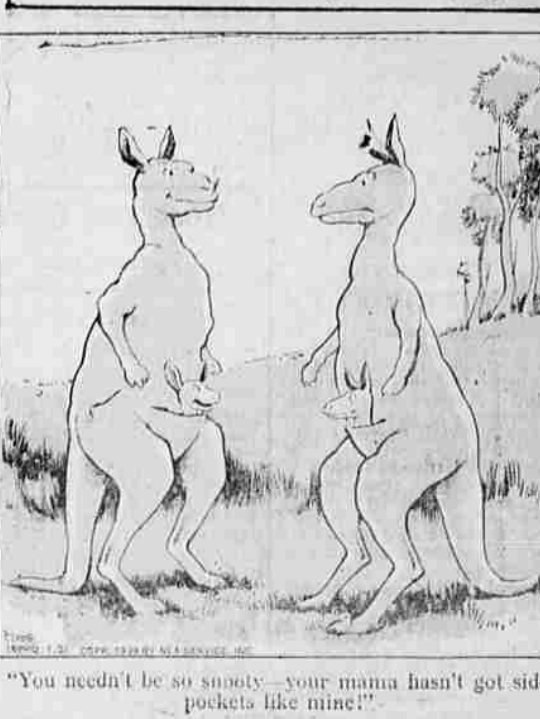
