Raymond Cummings, a WPA laborer, had stepped into an adjoining room, where Mrs. Cummings lay ill in bed, when the baby fell from her high chair into the hot water.

She was screaming under the scalding water, pouring from a faucet, when her father returned to the room.

Shutting off the water, Cummings laid the child on a table and searched frantically for a neighbor whom he begged by signs to notify a doctor.
