BUT RAILROAD GATE-CRASHER

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EVIDENCE VIA WIRE TAPPING IS UPHELD

NEW YORK, April 10.—(AP)—The United States circuit court of appeals today held "wire-tapped" intra-state telephone messages may be admitted in evidence, in a decision that is a landmark in the history of eavesdropping.
