BRITAIN, FRANCE BUY MANY U. S. PLANES WASHINGTON, April 12.—(AP)—Great Britain and France have obtained licenses for the export of approximately \$25,000,000 worth of war supplies from the United States in the first quarter of this year. The state department said today licenses had been issued for export to Great Britain in the amount of \$12,202,967 and to France for \$11,134,764. The supplies consist almost entirely of airplanes. Actual shipment run considerably under the licenses issued, totaling just over \$10,000,000 for the two countries. Britain so far this year has taken out of this country \$5,368,238 worth of war materials and France \$4,667,460. Japan disappeared entirely this month from the list of licensees.

PHILADELPHIA, April 12.—(AP)—National Commander Stephen Chadwick of the American Legion said today he opposed any leniency for Grover Cleveland Bergdoll, world war draft dodger whose wife says he plans to leave his Germany refuge and come to the United States to serve a military court sentence. Mrs. Bergdoll has said she will appeal anew to President Roosevelt to keep her husband out of prison, or shorten the term—almost five years—he must serve. Chadwick, sitting with a federal judge in a naturalization ceremony, said among other remarks: "Bergdoll was convicted of one of the most serious offenses of which a man can be guilty—that of running out of his country in a national emergency. He should get no leniency whatever. Other men who accepted the orders of this government are asleep in France."
