BALTIMORE "TORSO" KILLER CONFESSES
BALTIMORE, April 20.—(AP)—Aurelio Marco Tarquinio, 45, steelworker and former tavern keeper, was charged with East Baltimore's gruesome "torso" slaying today a few hours after the head of Evelyn Rice, 31, had been unearthed in his tulip-bordered backyard.

Police Commissioner Robert F. Stanton said the steelworker had confessed killing the Georgia girl who became barmaid and housekeeper for him. Officers who had conducted a fearful search since parts of the young woman's body began to be picked up piecemeal from sewers last Friday, found the last remains at dawn after arresting Tarquinio last night and grilling him for six hours.
