**TREATH WRITER TO MAYOR CAPTURED**

SEATTLE, April 21.—(AP)—Detective Lieut. R. F. Mahoney and colleagues today jailed Leonard Johnson, 31, jobless iron molder, without charge, and accused him of attempting to extort \$500 from Mayor Arthur B. Langlie with a threatening note.

They said they arrested Johnson when he took the money from a cache in a hotel where it had been placed at postal inspectors' advice. They said the letter demanded the money be left at the hotel. The letter was received at the mayor's office early this week, during Langlie's absence.

**NETHERLANDS VOTE SHOWS NAZIS LOSE**

AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands, April 21.—(AP)—Nazis lost heavily Wednesday in 11 provincial council elections which usually indicate the trend of national feeling.

The Nazis polled only four per cent of the vote in 1937 and they lost more than a third of that yesterday. Liberals gained three per cent, Christians 25, and Catholics one.

Communists lost 0.15 and socialists 0.6 per cent as compared with 1937.
