HARPHAM TALKS ON CARE OF FOREST

Forest administration now is vastly different from what it was 22 years ago when he first began the work here in the Umpqua valley. V. V. Harpham, Umpqua national forest supervisor, told members of the Roseburg Rotary club and their guests at the regular club meeting yesterday. In those days, the speaker said, a dozen men were expected to look after three times as much territory as is now within the Umpqua national forest.

Mr. Harpham also told of the progress being made on roads by the CCC camps. It may be possible, he said, to complete the road up the North Umpqua to Diamond lake by the end of this summer. At present four and one-half miles of road are yet to be built. The bridge across the river at Ilwaco is under construction, he said, and may be ready for use within two weeks.
