RESPONSE GOOD TO HEALTH ASSN. DRIVE

The annual Douglas County Public Health association membership drive, which opened April 21, is meeting with excellent response from the public, according to the general chairman, Mrs. Earl Wiley, who reports that residents of the county are giving their full support to the association this year.

Forty-three members have joined since the drive opened and various chairman in the county are being appointed to assist in the drive. Mrs. Alma May Lettice is acting as county chairman, with Mrs. R. G. Baker as Roseburg chairman. Mrs. E. H. Lakey is chairman at Drain, under the auspices of the Union Circle club. Miss Margaret Magee is Gunter hill district chairman. Other chairmen will be announced later.

The objectives of the membership drive are: (1) To spread information throughout the county regarding the work and objectives of the health unit; (2) To stimulate wider interest in the educational and preventive program of the health unit; (3) To make the interests of public health one of the foremost in the minds of the leaders of the county government; (4) To stimulate civic responsibility; (5) To assist in the development of a county-wide rounded public health program.

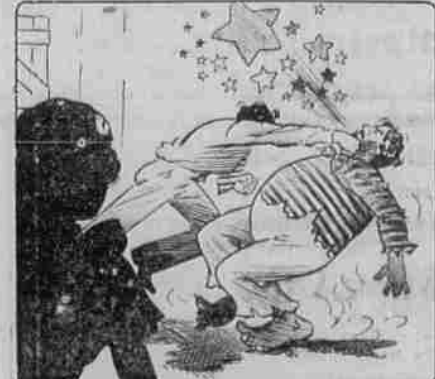
