MEMORIAL DAY TO BE OBSERVED HERE

Plans for observance of Memorial day are being formulated by members of the Roseburg Veterans council, of which Levi White is general chairman. P. M. Compton and V. J. Mitchell are in charge of the program to be held at the Indian theatre. A parade will be arranged by R. L. Preston, with John Dier as grand marshal. Transportation is to be handled by Ward H. Cummings, publicity by Roy Young and bands by H. L. Kippstein.

The program this year will differ somewhat from previous services. The program at the Indian theatre will be held at 9:30 a. m. and following this the parade will form and march to the Oak street bridge, where services will be held for the sailor dead. From there the parade will continue to the soldiers' home cemetery where services will be held at the grave of the Unknown Soldier.

Decorations of the theatre will be in charge of American Legion auxiliary. Service at the Oak street bridge will be given by the auxiliary of the United Spanish War Veterans. Rites at the Unknown Soldier's grave will be under the auspices of the auxiliary of Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The Veterans council is anxious that everybody will participate in the observance of Memorial day. It is felt that it should be a day of observance rather than a day of celebration, the council declares.
