FRANK M. GERMAN WINS NEW TRIAL

SALISBURY, Ore., May 9.—(AP)—Frank M. German, Portland, who was in charge of the loan department of the Fred W. German Co., won his appeal today when the supreme court ordered a new trial by reversing his conviction of larceny by bail.

German was indicted jointly with his father, Fred W. German, for allegedly taking money from clients. The company later went bankrupt.

Grounds for ordering the new trial were that the lower court should not have permitted a witness to testify that Fred W. German said, "Frank German spent all your money." This testimony was ruled as hearsay, and the statement was not made in the presence of Frank German.

The German decision, by Justice Lusk, reversed Judge Alfred P. Tolson of Portland.

WHEELER PLEADS GUILTY TO MURDER

SEATTLE, May 9.—(AP)—Leslie Thomas Wheeler, 53, transient fruit worker, changed his plea to guilty today to the first degree murder of Mrs. Daisy Mae Tillotson Moore, of Oregon City, 55, near Auburn last winter. She was beaten to death and her body partly buried near a railway dump.

By law, a jury must determine the punishment—death or life imprisonment. The trial will start Monday.
